3. The best four posters for all other research
4. The best two posters in any category from local participants

Publication: Abstracts with definitive scientific data may be considered for publication in the IJP.

Attendance: The Poster's "first author" must be the "presenter" during the scheduled Poster Session. Presenters who fail to attend the meeting will have their abstract removed from publication and consideration for awards.
