



# **Poster Awards**

**Eligibility:** First (presenting) author of any poster presented at the meeting will be eligible for the prize.

Adjudication: A panel of judges will review the posters.

Due to the large number of posters submitted, poster abstract papers will be reviewed upon submission and nominations for awards will first be selected **based on the quality of the submitted abstract**. Prizes will be awarded as follows:

- 2. The best three posters depicting clinical research
- 3. The best four posters for all other research
- The best two posters in any category from local participants

**Publication:** Abstracts with definitive scientific data may be considered for publication in the IJP.

**Attendance:** The Poster's "first author" must be the "presenter" during the scheduled Poster Session. Presenters who fail to attend the meeting will have their abstract removed from publication and consideration for awards.
